Star Room

This program has been running every Wednesday and next week will be its last. We hope to continue some of these strategies within our program and day to day routines.

Garden Room

The Garden Room children watched a Play School episode about Reconciliation "Walking Together" – fostering children's early understandings about our shared histories and the role we all play in building relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories and futures.

After watching this we focused on walking on Country Walking Together like the episode. With our peers we created our own footprint mural contributing to this very important conversation for your youngest citizens.

Rainbow Room

The Rainbow room have been enjoying our group times; reading 'the very hungry caterpillar' and 'we're going on a bear hunt'. We have utilised the use of the iPad and the children now watch the stories come to life through animated stories – which we all love!

The older children know almost every word off by heart and have created their own actions.

We have added a 'self-help' table which is going great to encourage children to take responsibility of their own health and wellbeing. Items on the table include their drink bottles, tissues and wet wipes.

Our favourite activities this month would definitely be craft and exploring the cooking materials in the sandpit.

Our fundamental movement chart is filling up with ticks this term with many of our children achieving different skills. We are still doing our reward chart, so keep bringing those yummy healthy lunches - we have added these straight to your child's portfolio instead of emailing them out, we are still going through and waiting for all our children to have a reward for both fruit and vegetables, moving onto a new reward. We have noticed some yummy new lunchbox snacks lately as well which is great.

Sunshine Room

All the new Sunshine Room children that have been transitioning from the Rainbow Room have started to settle in well and have been able to now adapt to our routine and play with ease. The Sunshine Room friends are such a great small group and all help, look out for each other and enjoy each other's company. Building these relationships with peers is priceless.

The past month has been pretty chilly so an extra layer sent into school with your child will make outside play more pleasant.

Caragabal

Over the last few weeks, the children have been enjoying bushwalking. They continue to excavate a couple of giant holes, which are their homes. They have a specific place for a fire, and this is kept going with sticks, leaves and dirt (which makes the fire "go better"). This year the children have started playing in a hollow between a couple of piles of overgrown dirt and rocks. This is their "special hideout", which has gates (long branches) and a passcode. They have also been collecting leaves, flowers and berries to make cakes and muffins.

Service Report

As per NSW Government advice, the front doors to the Service will remain locked until at least Friday 9th July 2021. Masks will be worn by educators when answering the door and interacting with families at drop-off and pick-up, and we ask that families wear masks when interacting with educators. Early Childhood educators are exempt from wearing masks while proving education and Care within a Service setting. We understand that a change of routine can be upsetting for children and families, and invite you to discuss any concerns or updates regarding your children with us. This can be done by phoning the Service, sending an email or by requesting a chat with an educator. Any child showing any cold or flu symptoms will be unable to attend the Service until they are symptom free.
