Hello Star Room Families.

During February we have focused on Sun Safety. We have done this through group experiences where we have looked at where to put sunscreen on our bodies, what sort of hat to wear, where to play when it is hot and how much water we need to drink each day. We have a regular sunscreen station set up in our room along with pictures around it to help remind children about sun safety. We regularly watched a short YouTube clip called George the Sun Safe Superstar. Now we have finished, the children have participated in making their own sun safe certificates they can keep. All this is displayed in our room on our sun safe wall. Please feel free to have a look.

Thank you so much to all our lovely families that have brought a photo in for 'Our Belonging Tree'. The children just love seeing their families up on the wall, it brings much discussion amongst peers.

We are focusing on sustainability over the next coming weeks with Clean up Australia day on the 7th March. We have been working on our new worm farm donated from Bunnings Young. Along with our new veggie beds in our front yard. We are looking forward to planting, caring for and watching them grow.

Another thank you goes to our families who have completed and brought in the "All about me" survey which has given us a lovely insight into our children personalities and also families goals. A common goal from families appears to be for our children to develop school readiness and social skills. In the upcoming weeks we will be focusing on developing positive social skills as this is very much an important, if not the most important school readiness skill preschool can offer children.

Reminders for parents:

Please remember to pack a spare change of clothes including undies, socks and pants. Accidents are still common and will happen from time to time even in the most confident of toilet trained children. Children feel much more comfortable changing into their own clothes too.

Our spare clothes supplies are also limited so if you have any preschool clothes at home please return these.

#### Garden Room

Clean up Australia Day has created lots of meaningful conversations with the children, resulting our excursion on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March. If your child attends on Friday, please ensure they have appropriate walking shoes.

#### Sunshine Room

What an adventure we have been on this month. Exploring animals of the jungle has been fun. We have engaged in many different animal crafts and have transformed our locker area into a tree from the jungle, filled with monkeys, lions, snakes and giraffes. If you have not been into see it, please come on in and see our creative tree. We have also learnt a new song all about the Itsy Bitsy Monkey. We have enjoyed tapping sticks also and have our favorite songs we love to perform but are learning some new songs also.

We have all settled well into the room and our days are filled with plenty of giggles, laughs and learning.

# Caragabal

We have had a great start to the year, including welcoming two new children.

This term we started talking to the children about having our own totem, like the Wiradjuri do. We hope that talking about caring for our totem and its habitat, it will give the children a more personal link to caring to the world. After some discussion they chose the Koala. They even decided to add it to our 'Acknowledgement of Country'! We found a book called 'How the Koala Got Its Claws', watched a couple of videos and learnt some very interesting facts about Koalas. The children at the school made a Koala last year which sits in the office, so we went on an excursion to see it. Now we are planning to make our own Koala.

We are also starting to include more loose parts in the program this year (Loose parts are any loose, tactile materials and found objects that children can move about during play and exploration. They are versatile, open-ended and can be added to any learning environment for children to adapt and to turn into anything their imagination allows.). If anyone has any items, they think we could use, please let us know. Some examples of loose parts are: bottle caps, cardboard tubes, recycled spools and wheels from thread and ribbon, fabric remnants, silk scarves, ribbons, bangles, costume jewellery building and household project remnants

### Quandialla

We welcome our new children and their families to the Quandialla preschool. We hope your children enjoy their time with us.

This term we have started a worm farm with the children. We use our food scraps from the day to add to it, which the children are enjoying. We are learning what worms like to eat and hopefully once they make their castings, we can use them on our garden we are going to start.

The children from years 4, 5, 6 at Quandialla school have also been bringing over some scraps from their morning fruit break. We love working and interacting with the school community.

We had a fire drill this month with the whole school. We practice these so educators and children know what to do in case of a real fire.

#### Reminders

Please do not park in the Bus or Disabled Zones. The fines for parking in the Bus Zone are \$337.00 and 2 points.

If you park in the Disabled Zone without a permit, the fine is \$697.00 and no loss of points.

Parking in these areas make it problematic for the buses to pull in and becomes a safety issue when dropping off and picking up children.
