We welcome more feedback on this change in our settling in period. The Garden Room as also sent out Family Service Plans for parents to complete and return.




Sunshine Room

Changes to enrolment

The Board of Directors have made some operational decisions that may affect your child's enrolment into the future.

Effective March 1, 2021, the "two weeks' notice for absence" will no longer be available. This means that if your child is going to be absent from the Service for holidays for example, you will be required to pay for the position. This is a decision based on best practice in the sector and operational development for the Service.

Furthermore, wherever possible, casual bookings will be accommodated however due to the increased numbers in permanent bookings, we will no longer be able to guarantee casual bookings on demand. Requests for casual bookings must be made with 24 hours' notice.

Grenfell Girl Guides

Girl Guides offers an inclusive, nurturing, and safe environment where girls and young women take part in a wide range of fun activities and adventures, delivered through a dynamic and flexible non-formal educational program. Designed by girls and delivered by girls, the activities across each age group of the Girl Guide program reflect the interests of girls at that stage of life.

The world of a young girl is more complex than ever before; school pressures, family life, a digital reality, global perspectives and raised expectations, means navigating their own path can be sometimes tough and confusing. What they need more than ever is a community of people they can call their own. A place where they are considered perfect just as they are, a place they can try new things, learn new skills, make life-long friends, and develop a rounded view of the world. A place where they can carve their own journey, choose what to learn, be challenged, discover new talents, have adventures, be creative, and most importantly—have fun.

We are looking for more girls to join our local unit. At the moment our Unit is called a 'Flexible Unit' covering girls from 7 – 14 years old but we would love to be able to start a Pre-Junior Guide Unit in Grenfell 5 – 7years. Girls will join a group of four to six girls (called a 'Patrol') that meets once a week. With the help of an adult Leader the girls decide what stuff they want to do.

Grenfell Girl Guides (Flexible Unit) meet after school on Tuesday afternoon from 3:30 to 5 pm at the Guide Hall in East Street.
